What is the JSNA?

- Joint Strategic Needs Assessment
- Underpinned by legislation (Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act, 2007)
- Innovation in public policy
- Identify the current and future health and wellbeing needs of the community
- Identifies inequalities

What is the JSNA?

- Joint responsibility of Director of Public Health, Director of Adult Social Services and Director of Childrens' Services
- Main responsibility lies with PCT and Local Authority, but partners can contribute
- Community engagement is a key component of the process

What is the JSNA?

- Aims to influence:
 - commissioning decisions
 - priority-setting
 - Sustainable Community Strategy
 - Local Area Agreement

What is the JSNA?

- Other aims
 - Map out local aspirations
 - Combine and mobilise efforts of LSP partners to promote better health and wellbeing
 - Strengthen partnerships

North Tyneside JSNA 2008

- Initiated in 2008 and led by Prof Vivien Hollyoak
- Steering group formed comprising representation from LSP themed partnerships, information officers, public engagement lead, public health

Health

- Tackling health inequalities to reduce the inequality gap, especially in
 - life expectancy
 - coronary heart disease
 - cancer mortality
 - obesity

North Tyneside JSNA 2008

Health

- Obesity
 - 20% adults
 - 15% of children under 11 years
- Alcohol
 - Alcohol-related hospital admissions
- Tobacco control
 - Smoking prevalence high
 - Smoking quitters not hitting targets

North Tyneside JSNA 2008

Health

- Sexual health
 - Chlamydia screening
 - Opportunistic – systematic
- Mental health
 - Proxy measures of mental ill-health suggests that rates are significantly worse than England average

North Tyneside JSNA 2008

Adult social care

- Rising expectations
- Changing age profile
- Personalisation and self-directed support
- Support for carers (especially unpaid)
- Long-term conditions
- Early interventions
- Adult drug treatment – use of service and continuing care

North Tyneside JSNA 2008

Children and young people

- Smoking
 - during pregnancy
 - passive smoking
- Breastfeeding
 - Initiation and sustained rates are lowest in country
- Obesity
 - Get Kids Active
 - Diet
 - Healthy School Award

- Chlamydia screening
- Teenage pregnancy
 - Ongoing challenge
 - LARC
- Alcohol
- Substance misuse
- Attempted suicide
- CAMHS

- Children safe-guarding
 - Children in need
 - Looked after children
 - Child protection
- Children's activities
 - Children's Centres and childcare
 - Safer play places
- Children's economic well-being
 - Child poverty
